October 2019

• Attorney Zaknoen opened bids to be tabulated:

Upon motion made by Sam Johns, seconded by John Haynes, the board unanimously approved awarding the bid to *Larsen-Danielson, Co.* in the amount of three-hundred forty-two thousand and nine hundred sixty (\$342,960.00) dollars, contingent upon engineering and legal review.

• Kick off meeting with *Larson-Danielson* and *Edgewater Resources* scheduled for Wednesday, October 23rd.

November 2019

• *Larson-Danielson* started replacing the decking on the 200 dock. They had thirty (30') feet of old decking removed and installed ten (10') feet of the new decking.

December 2019

• *Larson-Danielson* continues replacing the decking on the 200 dock and are approximately onequarter of the way to completing it.
